PART A – BID SUBMISSION

Replace: 30-2007 Bid Submission with 30-2007 Addendum 1 - Bid Submission. The following is a summary of changes incorporated in the replacement Bid Submission:

Form B(R1): revised the approximate annual quantities and changed Item 5. to OSB (Oriented Strand Board).

PART E – SPECIFICATIONS

Revise: E2.8 to read: Item No. 5 – OSB (Oriented Strand Board) board-up shall consist of the OSB (Oriented Strand Board) and all other material required for the board-up and securing of the building. To include but not be limited to OSB (Oriented Strand Board), nails and screws. OSB (Oriented Strand Board) should be 4" x 8" x 3/8". If, during the Contract period, a partial piece of OSB (Oriented Strand Board) is used for board-up of a building the cost per sheet shall be pro-rated to reflect the approximate quantity of OSB (Oriented Strand Board) used. E.g. if only 1/2 sheet of OSB (Oriented Strand Board) is used the price shown on Form B: Prices item 5 shall be divided in half.

Revise: E3.1 to read: Winnipeg Police Service requires the securing of a building that they have responded to if the Owner is not present and the building has to be secured. A member of Winnipeg Police Services must stay with the building until it can be secured by the Contractor. The Contractor is required to secure the building with either new locks/hasps, deadbolts, and/or OSB (Oriented Strand Board). Only those doors or windows that will allow easy access to a building that have been vandalized/broken need to be secured. The average time required to secure a building is 1 to 2 hours. The amount of supplies varies by the number of windows, doors, openings, etc. that need to be secured
