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REQUEST FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST

B1. DEFINITIONS

B1.1 When used in this Request for Expression of Interest:

- (a) "**Business Day**" means any Calendar Day, other than a Saturday, Sunday, or a Statutory or Civic Holiday;
- (b) "**Calendar Day**" means the period from one midnight to the following midnight;
- (c) "**City**" means the City of Winnipeg as continued under The City of Winnipeg Charter, Statutes of Manitoba 2002, c. 39, and any subsequent amendments thereto;
- (d) "**City Contact**" means a person designated as such in the REOI;
- (e) "**City Council**" means the Council of the City of Winnipeg;
- (f) "**Contractor**" means the person undertaking the performance of the work under the terms of the Contract;
- (g) "**Customers of the Service**" means any user of the service;
- (h) "**ISP**" means Internet Service Provider;
- (i) "**Public Wi-Fi Service**" means publicly-accessible Internet access over Wi-Fi that is fully implemented, administered and supported by a Third Party on behalf of the City of Winnipeg;
- (j) "**may**" indicates an allowable action or feature which will not be evaluated;
- (k) "**must**" or "**shall**" indicates a mandatory requirement which will be evaluated on a pass/fail basis;
- (l) "**Person**" means an individual, firm, partnership, association or corporation, or any combination thereof, and includes heirs, administrators, executors or legal representatives of a person;
- (m) "**Proponent**" means any Person or consortium submitting an Information Submission in response to this Request for Expression of Interest;
- (n) "**should**" indicates a desirable action or feature which will be evaluated on a relative scale;
- (o) "**Site**" means the lands and other places on, under, in or through which the work is to be performed;
- (p) "**Submission or Information Submission**" means that portion of the Request for Expression of Interest which must be completed or provided and submitted by the Submission Deadline;
- (q) "**Submission Deadline**" means the time and date for final receipt of Submissions;
- (r) "**Substantial Performance**" shall have the meaning attributed to it in The Builders' Liens Act (Manitoba), or any successor legislation thereto.

B2. BACKGROUND

- B2.1 The City of Winnipeg ("City") is the seventh largest city in Canada with an area of over 450km² and a population of over 800,000 people. City Hall is located in downtown Winnipeg, which is the fastest growing high-income neighborhood in the city; more than 72,000 people work and over 40,000 students attend university and college classes downtown.
- B2.2 City services include Transit, Police, Parking, Water & Waste, Public Works, Community Services, Libraries, Fire & Paramedics, and many more. City sites are distributed throughout Winnipeg and include swimming pools, arenas, bus terminals, district firehalls and police stations, libraries, community centres and office buildings.

- B2.3 There is general acknowledgement that free Wi-Fi Internet service in a city is desirable for citizens and visitors alike. The City of Winnipeg currently accommodates Wi-Fi Internet services in the following ways:
- (a) Password-protected access for visitors of specific locations like the Council Chamber;
 - (b) Free and open access at Libraries and select swimming pools (see Appendix A) through a managed service contract expiring June 30, 2018; and
 - (c) Facility access agreements for Internet Service Providers (“ISPs”) to operate their own Wi-Fi hotspots within over 140 City-related sites including community centres (see Appendix B). Terms of service are set by the ISPs and may be free, paid and/or exclusively for the benefit of their own customers.

B3. PURPOSE OF THE REQUEST FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST DOCUMENT

- B3.1 The City is interested in addressing these needs:
- (a) Exploring a suitable replacement for the free and open Public Wi-Fi Service at all Winnipeg Public Library branches and select swimming pools, which expires June 30, 2018 (see Appendix A);
 - (b) Expanding the service referred to in B3.1(a) to additional sites currently served by ISP hotspots (see Appendix B) as well as potential new candidates including major transit bus terminals, parks and other outdoor venues (See Appendix C); and
 - (c) Maintaining a high-quality service in an innovative and sustainable fashion for the service provider, while being no cost to the City or Customers of the Service.
- B3.2 Based on the aforementioned needs, the purpose of this Request for Expression of Interest (REOI) is to identify experienced and capable Respondents to determine:
- (a) The criteria that contribute to the value proposition of Public Wi-Fi Service at a given site (e.g. visitor traffic, coverage area, public amenities and events), and therefore the relative candidacy of City locations being considered;
 - (b) Interest within the private sector to respond to a future RFP for the installation, administration and support of Public WI-Fi Service at current and future City locations; and
 - (c) Innovative business models for the provision of this service, at no cost to the City or its constituents and within the bounds set by the City’s Winnipeg Sponsorship Policy and Advertising Policy (see Section B5).

B4. THE CITY’S SPONSORSHIP PROGRAM.

- B4.1 The City invites qualified individuals to submit an Information Submission in response to this REOI.
- B4.2 After receiving the Submissions to this REOI, the City will review all Submissions received and use the information to make an informed decision to proceed to Request for Expression Of Interest and/or Request for Proposals, and further in the development of specifications.
- B4.3 Following completion of the REOI stage, shortlisted Respondents will be invited to provide detailed proposals in response to an RFP that will be structured following best practices used in other Canadian jurisdictions. The RFP will include several submission stages related to technical, financial and, if needed, innovation components. The City will evaluate the detailed proposals received from the shortlisted Respondents and select the preferred Respondents for the intended Services.
- B4.4 The City reserves the right to invite only shortlisted Respondents to this REOI to respond to any subsequent RFP.

B5. REQUIREMENTS SUMMARY

B5.1 Overview

- (a) It is the City's expectation that there are creative ways in which the City could work with an outside Contractor to provide Public Wi-Fi Service in City buildings in an innovative and sustainable fashion.
- (b) Respondents are requested to offer their comments on how reasonable the following requirements or expectations (B5.2 – B5.6) are.

B5.2 Services

- (a) It is the City's expectation that under any potential future Public Wi-Fi Service Contract with a Contractor, that such a Contractor would bear all of the costs of supervision, labour, service facilities, repair or replacement parts, test equipment, and supplies necessary to maintain the Public Wi-Fi Service to the standards of performance and operation specified by the City.

B5.3 Summary of Expected Solution Outcomes

- (a) It is the City's expectation that a Public Wi-Fi Service, once operational at City public buildings would:
 - (i) Be scalable, secure, and highly available (99.9% uptime, preferably 7x16 with sufficient coverage for each site's needs);
 - (ii) Be future-proof in its design, leveraging standards such as 802.11ac and Hot Spot 2.0 (Wi-Fi Certified Passpoint);
 - (iii) Include a wireless broadband network that supports highly granular, location specific coverage, at a minimum, of one area per facility in order to offer access to the greatest number of people;
 - (iv) Offer support for a wide-ranging device types such as laptop computers, smartphones, gaming devices, tablets, and any other popular retail devices typically used by the Public that can take advantage of Wi-Fi networks;
 - (v) Be compatible with the most common web browsers including Internet Explorer, Edge, Firefox, Safari and Google Chrome. The Respondent should identify any potential compatibility problems;
 - (vi) Have customer support available (preferably bilingual, seven days/week 6 AM to 10 PM Central Time). Support must include but not be limited to: support and troubleshooting in cases of non-connectivity, addition of new devices to the Public Wi-Fi Service;
 - (vii) Allow Public Wi-Fi Service to be scheduled, preferably on a site-by-site basis;
 - (viii) Offer reporting on Public Wi-Fi Service usage by location, time and date, including bandwidth and anonymized/aggregate Internet access sessions;
 - (ix) Operate separately and entirely independent from the City's private Wi-Fi infrastructure, local/municipal network infrastructure including existing data cabling, ISP and other service providers, and computing infrastructure;
 - (x) Not interfere with the City's private Wi-Fi infrastructure or ISP hotspots that may reside in some of the same locations;
 - (xi) Accommodate addition and deletion of sites as per the City's requirements;
 - (xii) Have capability to restrict access to certain Internet sites (e.g. Pornography sites) at the City's discretion; and
 - (xiii) Have capability to offer outdoor, portable Public Wi-Fi services that could be deployed on an ad-hoc need at special outdoor events, etc.
- (b) Respondents are to comment on the viability of the above expectations in their response.

B5.4 Business Model – Summary Overview

- (a) It is the City's expectation that:
 - (i) If Public Wi-Fi Service is to be made available in its public buildings, it must be robust and offer reliable Internet access while Customers of the service are in the facilities;
 - (ii) Any potential future proposal would include Public Wi-Fi Service in sites currently served by the City's managed service contract (see Appendix A), with the possibility of expanding to additional sites in priority sequence (see Appendix C);
 - (iii) A selected Proponent of a future proposal would be fully responsible to implement, administer and support the Public Wi-Fi Service;
 - (iv) The solution will be separate and entirely independent from the City's private Wi-Fi infrastructure, local/municipal network infrastructure including existing data cabling, ISP and other service providers, and computing infrastructure;
 - (v) Dependent on the levels of investment and ownership agreements that might be selected and thereafter contracted with a selected Proponent, the City could end up receiving a portion of the revenues generated by the selected solution; and
 - (vi) A selected Proponent of a future proposal could be granted some of the benefits ordinarily afforded to sponsors, subject to negotiation.
- (b) Respondents are to comment on the viability of the above expectations in their response.

B5.5 Technical and Security Overview

- (a) As part of this REOI process, the City is interested in understanding:
 - (i) The technologies that the Respondent plans to use to provide the Public Wi-Fi Service (e.g. backhaul and endpoint standards and technologies, bandwidth and performance, etc.);
 - (ii) How aspects of security would be addressed (e.g. confidentiality, anonymity, authentication, etc.);
 - (iii) How support will be provided, preferably on a 7x16 basis; and
 - (iv) How aspects of usage would be addressed (e.g. illegal activity, white/blacklisting of sites at the City's discretion, bandwidth management, etc.).
- (b) Respondents are to provide a high-level overview of these aspects of their Public Wi-Fi Service in their response.

B5.6 Respondent Requirements

- (a) As part of this REOI process, the City is interested in understanding what Respondent requirements should be taken into consideration to help achieve the objectives stated in B5 - Requirements Summary, for example:
 - (i) What would the Respondent need from the City, from a technical or facility perspective to enable the Public Wi-Fi Service (e.g. power for access points, secure closets for equipment, etc.)?
 - (ii) What length of term would a Respondent seek a Contract for?
 - (iii) What are other requirements the Respondent would need from the City to enable the Public Wi-Fi Service?
 - (iv) What, if any, type of advertising of the service would the Respondent expect (e.g. posters inside facilities, stickers on doorways, tent cards, etc.)?
 - (v) What additional information would the City need to provide in a potential subsequent RFP for Respondents to be able to present a bid?
- (b) Respondents are to address each above question in their response.

B6. SPONSORSHIP AND ADVERTISING

- B6.1 Sponsorship opportunities shall follow all policies and guidelines described on the City of Winnipeg's Sponsor Winnipeg web page: <http://winnipeg.ca/sponsorwinnipeg/>
- B6.2 Notably, as per the City of Winnipeg Sponsorship Policy, the City will not enter into agreements with companies that promote the use of tobacco or the sale of alcohol to underage youth. Any proposed advertising which involves marketing concepts that explicitly or implicitly stereotype or otherwise denigrate individuals or groups will be considered non-responsive, as well as marketing concepts that unnecessarily promote the commercialization of public space. Finally, the City would decline sponsorship proposals from parties involved in a lawsuit or otherwise debarred from doing business with the City.
- B6.3 The City will not accept advertising that is contrary to its service role or that the City, in its sole discretion, determines is not in the best interest of the City. Advertising initiatives will be consistent with the City's vision, mission and values, and not compromise or contradict any legislation, City by-law or policy, or reflect negatively on the City's public image.
- B6.4 The acceptance of advertising on City assets does not act as the City's endorsement of any one product or services over another.

B7. SCHEDULE

- B7.1 The City intends to:
- (a) review the Information Submissions and schedule demonstrations of Respondent's product(s) by December 5, 2017;
 - (b) have the demonstrations during the week of December 11 to 15, 2017 in Winnipeg.

B8. ENQUIRIES

- B8.1 All enquiries shall be directed to the City Contact identified in B9.
- B8.2 Any Respondent who has questions as to the meaning or intent of any part of this document or who believes this document contains any error, inconsistency or omission should make an enquiry prior to the Submission Deadline requesting clarification, interpretation or explanation in writing to the City Contact.
- B8.3 If the Respondent finds errors, discrepancies or omissions in the document, or is unsure of the meaning or intent of any provision therein, the Respondent shall promptly notify the City Contact of the error, discrepancy or omission at least five (5) Business Days prior to the Submission Deadline.
- B8.4 If the Respondent is unsure of the meaning or intent of any provision therein, the Respondent should request clarification as to the meaning or intent prior to the Submission Deadline.
- B8.5 Responses to enquiries which, in the sole judgment of the City Contact, require a correction to or a clarification of the REOI will be provided by the City Contact to all Respondents by issuing an addendum.
- B8.6 Responses to enquiries which, in the sole judgment of the City Contact, do not require a correction to or a clarification of the REOI will be provided by the City Contact only to the Respondent who made the enquiry.
- B8.7 The Respondent shall not be entitled to rely on any response or interpretation received pursuant to B8 unless that response or interpretation is provided by the City Contact in writing.

B10. ADDENDA

- B10.1 The City Contact may, at any time prior to the Submission Deadline, issue addenda correcting errors, discrepancies or omissions in the REOI, or clarifying the meaning or intent of any provision therein.
- B10.2 The City Contact will issue each addendum at least two (2) Business Days prior to the Submission Deadline, or provide at least two (2) Business Days by extending the Submission Deadline.
- (a) The Addenda will be available on the Bid Opportunities page at the Materials Management Division's website at <http://www.winnipeg.ca/matmgt/bidopp.asp>
- B10.2.1 The Respondent is responsible for ensuring that he/she has received all addenda and is advised to check the Materials Management Division's website for addenda regularly and shortly before the Submission Deadline, as may be amended by addendum.
- B10.3 The Respondent should acknowledge receipt of each addendum on Form A: Request for Expression Of Interest Application.

B11. CONFIDENTIALITY AND PRIVACY

- B11.1 Information provided to a Respondent by the City or acquired by a Respondent by way of further enquiries or through investigation is confidential. Such information shall not be used or disclosed in any way without the prior written authorization of the City. The Respondent shall not make any statement of fact or opinion regarding any aspect of the REOI and any subsequent proposal to the media or any member of the public without the prior written authorization of the City.
- B11.2 The protection of personal information and privacy will be fundamental aspects of the Project. Respondents shall comply with all applicable privacy legislation, including but not limited to the Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act (Canada) ("PIPEDA"). In addition, Respondents are advised that the City is subject to The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (Manitoba) ("FIPPA") and that the Respondent will be expected to comply with the obligations imposed upon the City pursuant to FIPPA.
- B11.3 To the extent permitted, the City shall treat all Submissions as confidential. However, the Respondent is advised that any information contained in any Submission may be released if required by The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (Manitoba), by other authorities having jurisdiction, or by law or by City policy or procedures (which may include access by members of City Council).
- B11.4 All Information Submissions submitted to the City will be kept in confidence with the City for the sole purposes of evaluating and developing the best possible strategic option for the City. Information Submissions will become the property of the City. The City will have the right to make copies of all Submissions for its internal review process and to provide such copies to its staff and/or external advisors and representatives.
- B11.5 All information will become and remain the property of the City; none will be returned. If the application contains any proprietary or trade secret information, said information must be indicated as such.

B12. NON-DISCLOSURE

- B12.1 Respondents must not disclose any details pertaining to their REOI and the selection process in whole or in part to anyone not specifically involved in their Submission, without the prior written approval of the City. Respondents shall not issue a news release or other public announcement pertaining to details of their Information Submission or the selection process without the prior written approval of the City.
- B12.2 Respondents are advised that an attempt on the part of any Respondent or any of its employees, agents, Respondents or representatives to contact any members of City Council or their staff or any member of City Administration other than the City Contact with respect to this REOI solicitation, may lead to disqualification.

B13. RESPONDENT'S COSTS AND EXPENSES

- B13.1 Respondents are solely responsible for their own costs and expenses in preparing and submitting an Information Submission and participating in the REOI, including the provision of any additional information or attendance at meetings or demonstrations of the product(s).

B14. NO CONTRACT

- B14.1 By submitting an Information Submission and participating in the process as outlined in this document, Respondents expressly agree that no contract of any kind is formed under, or arises from this REOI, and that no legal obligations will arise. The City will have no obligation to enter into negotiations or a Contract with a Respondent.
- B14.2 Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the City reserves the right and the full power to amend or cancel this REOI at any time.

SUBMISSION INSTRUCTIONS

B15. SUBMISSION DEADLINE

- B15.1 The Submission Deadline is 4:00 p.m. Winnipeg time, November 8, 2017.
- B15.2 The City Contact or the Manager of Materials may extend the Submission Deadline by issuing an addendum at any time prior to the time and date specified in B15.1.
- B15.3 Information Submissions will not be opened publicly.
- B15.4 The Information Submission should be submitted enclosed and sealed in an envelope clearly marked with the REOI number and the Respondent's name and address.
- B15.5 Information Submissions submitted by facsimile transmission (fax) or internet electronic mail (e-mail) will not be accepted.

B16. INFORMATION SUBMISSION

- B16.1 The Information Submission should consist of the following components:
(a) Form A: Request for Expression Of Interest Application;

- B16.2 All requirements of the REOI should be fully completed or provided, and submitted by the Respondent no later than the Submission Deadline, with all required entries made clearly and completely to constitute a responsive REOI.
- B16.3 All Submissions received in response to this REOI will be kept in confidence with the sole purposes of evaluating and developing the best possible strategic option for the City.
- B16.4 Submissions and the information they contain will be the property of the City upon receipt. No Submissions will be returned.

Format

- B16.5 Respondents should submit one (1) unbound original (marked "original") and ^ (^) copies.
- (a) Each requirement should be addressed in a separate section clearly marked with the corresponding letter;
- B16.6 The City reserves the right to make additional copies of all Submissions for its internal review process.

B17. FORM A: REQUEST FOR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST APPLICATION

- B17.1 Further to B16.1(a), the Respondent shall complete Form A: Request for Expression Of Interest Application, making all required entries.
- B17.2 Paragraph 2 of Form A: Request for Expression Of Interest Application shall be completed in accordance with the following requirements:
- (a) if the Respondent is a sole proprietor carrying on business in his/her own name, his/her name shall be inserted;
- (b) if the Respondent is a partnership, the full name of the partnership shall be inserted;
- (c) if the Respondent is a corporation, the full name of the corporation shall be inserted;
- (d) if the Respondent is carrying on business under a name other than his/her own, the business name and the name of every partner or corporation who is the owner of such business name shall be inserted.
- B17.2.1 If the Submission is submitted jointly by two or more persons, each and all such persons shall identify themselves in accordance with B17.2.
- B17.3 In Paragraph 3 of Form A: Request for Expression Of Interest Application, the Respondent shall identify a contact person who is authorized to represent the Respondent for purposes of this REOI.
- B17.4 Paragraph 7 of Form A: Request for Expression Of Interest Application should be signed in accordance with the following requirements:
- (a) if the Respondent is sole proprietor carrying of business in his/her own name, it shall be signed by the Respondent;
- (b) if the Respondent is a partnership, it shall be signed by the partner or partners who have authority to sign for the partnership;
- (c) if the Respondent is a corporation, it shall be signed by its duly authorized officer or officers and the corporate seal, if the corporation has one, should be affixed;
- (d) if the Respondent is carrying on business under a name other than his/her own, it shall be signed by the registered owner of the business name or by the registered owner's authorized officials if the owner is a partnership or a corporation.
- B17.5 The name and official capacity of all individuals signing Form A: Request for Expression Of Interest Application should be printed below such signatures.
- B17.6 All signatures should be original.

B17.7 If a Submission is submitted jointly by two or more persons, the word “Respondent” shall mean each and all such persons, and the undertakings, covenants and obligations of such joint Respondents in the Submission, shall be both jointly and several.
