New program, Strong Girls, Strong World Winnipeg, seeks future leaders

Winnipeg, Manitoba — During the summer of 2015, the Status of Women Canada has launched a nation-wide project called Strong Girls, Strong World (SGSW). Councils of girls aged 16-19 are being formed in cities across Canada to receive the supports to become empowered, and plan their own innovation strategies against predetermined topics. The YMCA-YWCA of Winnipeg is seeking members for the SGSW Winnipeg council, which will be working to combat intimate partner violence.

By examining violence through an intersectional lens, the SGSW Winnipeg project aims to provide the necessary supports (which may include education through workshops, networking, or developing skills in various forms of media), mentorship, and leadership training to young girls who are interested in influencing social change. The SGSW Winnipeg council is intended to be inclusive* to all experiences of young women, transgender, and non-binary people.

Applicants are encouraged to apply, regardless of socio-economic background or experience, and SGSW Winnipeg will provide transportation, childcare, and will do it's best to remove participation barriers. Members should expect a safe space to share ideas, grow, and empower one another.

The official council will be assembled by November 2015, and its members will determine the plan of action. Additional information about the council and how to apply is listed at www.ywinnipeg.ca/jobs

The project was launched after Canada led the call for the International Day of the Girl at the United Nations, in order to celebrate the capacity of young girls and acknowledge that their rights matter.
