Notice of Upcoming Construction in the St. James Neighbourhood

Starting the week of August 12, 2013, we will begin installing new land drainage sewers to help protect businesses and homes in this area from basement flooding. The new sewers will also help protect the water quality of our rivers and Lake Winnipeg by reducing the frequency of combined sewer overflows.

Tri-Core Projects Manitoba Ltd. will be the contractor for this project.

Construction area

This work will take about five to six months and will include installing sewers on:

- Ness Avenue between Berry Street and Madison Avenue
- Madison Street between Silver Avenue and Ness Avenue
- Kensington Street between Silver Avenue and Ness Avenue

Services maintained during construction

• Your water and sewer service will not be interrupted.

Parking and traffic during construction

We will always maintain:

- access to your private approach,
- at least one lane of eastbound and westbound traffic on Ness Avenue.

There will be some parking and traffic restrictions starting the week of August 12, 2013:

- Westbound traffic on Ness Avenue will be reduced to:
 - two lanes from Madison Avenue to Century Street
 - one lane (Century Street to Berry Street)
- Century Street around Ness

Attached is a map illustrating the traffic restrictions during the project.

We will do everything we can to minimize disruption to businesses, residents and the motoring public. We understand this work may cause you some inconvenience and we appreciate your patience.
